CUT TO TITLE CARD:

"PRESENTED BY LUCKY STRIKE".

CUT TO TITLE CARD:
"BE HAPPY - GO LUCKY
LUCKIES TASTE BETTER".

(MUSIC: VAMP AND BE HAPPY --

GO LUCKY -- SHORT VERSION)

CUT TO:

#115 BOAT

-2-

LUCKY STRIKE TV FILM COMMERCIAL #115 (MOTOR BOATING) (1:00)

OPEN ON MEDIUM CLOSEUP OF RUSS' HANDS MAKING THE LAST LOOP OF THE STARTING ROPE AROUND THE FLY WHEEL OF A SLIGHTLY BATTERED OUTBOARD MOTOR. HE PULLS VIOLENTLY, THE WHEEL SPINS AND STOPS DEAD.

WE PULL SWIFTLY BACK TO RUSS LOOKING FORLORNLY AT GRACE, THE STARTING ROPE DANGLING HELPLESSLY FROM HIS HAND. SHE SHRUGS PHILOSOPHICALLY AND OFFERS HIM A PACK OF LUCKIES.

THEY EACH TAKE A LUCKY
AND RUSS HOLDS THE
LIGHTER WHILE THEY LIGHT
UP. THEY THEN PUFF HAPPILY,
RELAXING AGAINST THE
GUNWALES OF THEIR IDLY
DRIFTING LITTLE BOAT.

IRIS ON -- FROM CAMERA TO SHAPE OF CARTON - AND FORM CARTON.

CAMERA PULLS BACK TO ALLOW CARTON TO FLOAT. "IS/MFT" ZOOMS UP FROM TOP LEFT OF CARTON AND HOLDS CENTER SCREEN.

THE CARTON TURNS ON ITS SIDE AND THE LETTERS "IS/MFT FLY DOWN INTO POSITION IN THE SENTENCE "LUCKY STRIKE MEANS FINE TOBACCO" ON CARTON.

POP ON ABOVE CARTON "IT'S TOASTED."

POP ON BELOW CARTON "TO TASTE BETTER" IN SYNC.

SINGERS (OVER)

Light up a Lucky

It's light-up time.

Be Happy Go Lucky It's light-up time.

For the taste that you like Light up a Lucky Strike Relax ... (MUSIC GLISS)

... it's light-up time.

ANDRE BARUCH (V.O.)

Great idea. Lean back, drift along, enjoy a wonderful cigarette.

Lucky Strike. Luckies always taste better.
LS/MFT?

Lucky Strike means <u>fine tobacco</u>
and the famous Lucky Strike
process ...
"IT'S TOASTED" ... makes that
naturally good-tasting tobacco ...
taste <u>even better</u>.

BARUCH (CONT'D)

IRIS WIPE -- FROM SHAPE OF CARTON -- BACK TO RUSS AND GRACE IN THE BOAT.

RUSS HAS REWOUND THE STARTING ROPE AND IS ABOUT TO PULL IT AGAIN WHEN GRACE STOPS HIM WITH A "WAIT A MOMENT" GESTURE.

AS GRACE THEN REACHES OVER, CUT TO CLOSEUP OF THE SWITCH. SHE FLICKS ON THE SWITCH WHICH ALL ALONG HAD BEEN OFF.

CUT BACK AS RUSS PULLS THE ROPE AND THE ENGINE STARTS. LAUGHING AND SMOKING HAPPILY THEY SPIN OFF WHILE GRACE SNUGGLES COMPORTABLY AGAINST RUSS.

PAN WITH BOAT AND HOLD IT CENTER SCREEN AS RUSS AND GRACE HEAD TOWARD OPEN WATER.

FROM WAKE OF BOAT ZOOM
UP SUPERED LUCKY CARTON
TO FULL SCREEN AND WIPE
ON IN SYNC: THE BEST
TASTING CIGARETTE YOU EVER
SMOKED."

Next time you're out for enjoyment --

make it even more enjoyable --light up a Lucky.

SINGERS (OVER)

For the taste that you like, Light up a Lucky Strike, Right now ...

(SPOKEN)

Light up a Lucky.

(SINGERS AGAIN)

It's light-up time.

ANDRE (OVER)

You'll say it's ...

... the best-tasting cigarette you ever smoked.

(AFTER OPENING COMMERCIAL)

JACK COMES OUT WEARING A CARNATION IN HIS LAPEL, TO

MUSIC & APPLAUSE.

JACK

Thank you, thank you, thank you, ladies and gentlemen, and welcome to the Lucky Strike Program.

Tonight...tonight...

(NOTICES CARNATION IN HIS LAPEL)

Isn't this a pretty flower?... You know, ordinarily I don't wear a carnation in my lapel... but there's a little old lady cutside the studio who sells flowers -- she must be ninety years old - and when I saw her sitting there today with that tattered shawl over her head, I just couldn't resist buying this flower from her. I gave her 50 cents for it. You know, when you do something like that, it really makes you feel so good ... Besides, wearing the flower while I'm working makes it deductible....Of course, speaking of deductions, I have been asked to read something here.

JACK (CONT'D)

This is very important. It's from the Income Tax Department.

(STARTS TO PUT GLASSES ON)

I only wear these on account of
the smog....I can see it better
...Now this is very important,
so I want you to listen to it...
(READS)

"Each year carelessly prepared tax returns cause your Department of Internal Revenue untold delay and inconvenience. So this year, before filing yours, please make sure that it is correct.

Remember ... your tax return is wrong if it is incorrectly figured ... illegible ... unsigned ... or if you have any money left over ... Also ... for those of you in Los Angeles who wish to pay your tax in person, this is to remind you that the income tax office is now on the first floor ... It used to be on the tenth floor but we're a little afraid ... this being Leap Year.

(TAKES OFF GLASSES)

JACK (CONT'D)

Why my writers think this is a funny subject for television, I'll never know. Speaking of taxes, I must tell you what Charlie Bagby, my piano player put down as business expense... eighty dollars for a fingerprint removing kit... And Frankie Remley, my guitar player ... three hundred dollars for Sen Sen ... Of course, his income tax is nothing. It's the liquor tax that kills him.... There's a fellow that really likes bourbon. When he sees a bottle, he's so anxious to get at it that he doesn't even bother with a corkscrew. He goes right at it with his teeth. In fact, Remley has swallowed so many corks he's the only man I know who can walk to Catalina....There's nothing funnier than to see Remley trying to take a bathYou think I'm making this υp.

JACK (CONT'D)

Anyway, to get on with the show, ladies and gentlemen...right now I'd like to present a young lady who was on my program last year and I asked her to come on again...So she flew from New York just for this engagement. A wonderful talent, and one of the singing stars of the Lucky Strike Hit Parade...Miss Gisele MacKenzie.

GISELE ENTERS TO APPLAUSE.

JACK

Well, Gisele, here we are together again....And it's so nice having you on my show.

GISELE

Thanks, Jack, it's nice to be here, but I feel sort of strange.

JACK

Strange? What do you mean?

GISELE

Well, I'm not used to being introduced without stepping out from behind Snookie Lanson.

Oh, that's right....He's on the Hit Parade. Snookie Lanson.... Snookie! How did he ever get a name like that?

GISELE

I don't know, and with a name like Gisele, I haven't got the nerve to ask him.

JACK

Well, you shouldn't feel that way....I think Gisele is a very pretty name....and incidentally, my favorite animal.

GISELE

That's Gazelle.

JACK

Oh, yes, yes. Now Gazelle...

Gisele...You know, talking
about names ... I have a very
peculiar middle name ... I
never use it and very few
people know about it.

GISELE

What is it?

JACK

Tecumsah...Jack Tecumsah Benny GISELE

--

Tecumsah?

Yes....it's an old Indian name.

GISELE

What does it mean?

JACK

Old Indian. That's the silliest thing we'll say today...But Gisele...getting back to the Hit Parade. I want you to know, I watch it every week and you're doing a wonderful job.

GISELE

Thank you, Jack...Oh, that reminds me. When I told Dorothy Collins I was coming out to be on your program, she told me to say hello for her and give you a kiss.

JACK

Oh well, go ahead.

(GISELE KISSES JACK)

JACK

We'll I thought she'd send a bigger kiss than that.

GISELE

She did, but when you carry it 5,000 miles it loses something.

Oh well, thank her for me anyway.

Now, Gisele I know everybody is
anxious to hear you sing....And
while you're on, I have go to my
dressing room and get something.

I'll be right back. Good luck.

(JACK GIVES GISELE A KISS)
I would have given her a bigger
kiss, but when you carry it for
62 years it loses something.

HE LEAVES AND GISELE DOES HER SONG.
POOR PEOPLE OF PARIS

CUT TO JACK'S DRESSING ROOM.

JACK IS IN THE DRESSING ROOM. TAKES VIOLIN CASE, PUTS IT ON TABLE AND OPENS IT. TAKES OUT VIOLIN, SHAKES IT BACK AND FORTH, AND A CLOUD OF DUST FLIES OUT FROM IT.

JACK

I wish Rochester would beat the rugs with something else....

Let's see, I'll take my good bow....

(TAKES OUT OF CASE)

and I'll need some rosin.....

VOICE (0.s.)

You can't go in there.

STEVE (0.S.)

What do you mean I can't go in.
I'm Steve Bradley, his publicity

AS HE IS CLOSING THE CASE, THE DOOR FLIES OPEN AND STEVE BRADLEY ENTERS, FOLLOWED BY A PHOTOGRAPHER WITH A FLASH CAMERA.

STEVE

Oh oh oh there you are, Jack...

I've been looking all over for you.

JACK

Hello Steve.

man.

STEVE

(TO PHOTOGRAPHER WHO IS ABOUT TO TAKE A PICTURE)

Hold it, Charlie, no pictures till he gets his make-up on.

JACK

I've got my make-up on.

STEVE

Oh.. Charlie, put on a yellow filter and do the best you can.

JACK

Don't be funny..and look Steve..

I haven't time for publicity
now.

STEVE

But you said you wanted me to come down and take some pictures of you.

(MAD)

Now now...What's news about me being in my dressing room? Where were you when I was buying flowers from the old lady?....Some publicity man...you're never around when I need you.

STEVE

0000000000hhh, I like that snarl, get it, Charley, get it.

THE PHOTOGRAPHER TAKES A PICTURE.

JACK

Wait a minute.

STEVE

That'll be great. Benny the Tiger.. Gives me a sensational idea for a publicity stunt. We can tie it right in with the circus being in town. We'll take a picture of you with your head in a lion's mouth.

JACK

Me put my head in a lion's mouth! Are you crazy? I wouldn't do a thing like that.

STEVE

Get that shot, Charlio...Benny, the Yellow Belly.

CHARLIE SNAPS A PICTURE.

JACK

Look, I've had enough of this..

And Charlie, tear up those pictures.

STEVE

What are you doing? I need pictures. I've got a three-page spread lined up for you in a very important magazine.

JACK

A three-page spread... Is that good.

STEVE

Good? It's sensational! The whole magazine's only four pages.

JACK

Four pages?

STEVE

It's shoved under every door in Pocatello, Idaho...

JACK

Oh. for heavens sake...I'm getting out of here.

HE STARTS TO LEAVE AND STEVE PULLS HIM BACK

STEVE

Look Benny, you're not cooperating If you want publicity, I need pictures with comph. You haven't taken a good picture since that one where you were lying on a bear skin rug.

JACK

What?

STEVE

And that was two years ago.

JACK

(LEAVING)

Look, Steve, I can't argue with you, I've got to go...You can take pictures after the show.

STEVE

(HOLLERING AFTER JACK)

Okay, okay..see you later....

(TO CHARLIE)

You know, Charlie, I can't understand that guy Benny..

You'd think he'd cooperate. I picked him up when he was nothing ...nobody even heard of him...

and I made a big star out of him.

CHARLIE

Gee, how long have you been with him?

STEVE

Six months...Come on, Charlie,
let's go. I hear there's a guy
around named Sinatra with a
promising voice. Let's go and nail him.
AS THEY LEAVE, WE CUT BACK TO STAGE.

(MUSIC AND APPLAUSE)

JACK COMES ON WITH VIOLIN TO APPLAUSE

JACK

You know, ladies and gentlemen, I like doing these shows where I get the opportunity to play the violin....And I've really been practising lately...because on the 28th of this month I'm giving a concert at the Municipal Auditorium in Oklahoma City with the local symphony. This is a charity affair...and I'm going to play some very difficult numbers. Now after the concert in Oklahoma City, I'm going on to visit all the key cities that I can work into my schedule.

LOIS PUSHES DON OUT ONTO THE STAGE, AND IS FOLLOWED BY THEIR SON HARLOW.

LOIS

Go ahead, Donald.

DON

But, Lois...

LOIS

Go ahead, go ahead.

JACK

Don....Mrs. Wilson...what is this?

LOIS

Go ahead, Don, tell him.

JACK

Somebody tell me, I'm in the middle of a show.

DON

Well, Jack, you know how anxious we are for our son to become an announcer.

JACK

Oh no, not again. I gave him a chance a few weeks ago and he couldn't remember one line of the commercial...It was so embarrassingeven you got mad at him and pushed him off the stage.

LOIS

That's why I came down today.

The whole thing was Don's fault.

DON

My fault?

LOIS

Yes.... You see, Jack, our boy is very sensitive and Don doesn't know how to handle him.

JACK

(LOOKS AT HARLOW)

Sensitive? Look, Mrs. Wilson...

I'd be very happy to give him
another chance, but how do I know
the same thing won't happen?

LOIS

Because, I've been working with him. All he needed was someone who had a little patience and could give him a feeling of confidence. Now please, Jack... for my sake, give him another chance.

JACK

Well...all right.

LOIS

Now Harlow, go ahead and recite the commercial....and don't be nervous..Mother's standing right beside you.

HARLOW

Okay.

(CLEARS THROAT)

LS, MFT...LS, MFT...

Lucky Strike means fine tobacco.

Yes, Lucky Strike means fine

tobacco. For the taste that you

....that you.....

LOIS

(SWEETLY)

That you like, dear.

HARLOW

Oh, yes....For the taste that

you like, doer, light up a Lucky Strike

....the cigarette that's so round,

LOIS

Packed.

HARLOW

Fully packed ... and so.. and so..

...and so--

DON

(MAD)

And so free and easy on the draw!

HARLOW

And so free and easy on the draw!

Don, you're making him nervous.

Lois was right. You don't know

how to handle him. Continue

son -- I mean, Harlow.

HARLOW

Okay...Lucky Strike is made of fine -- made of fine --

LOIS

(BEGINNING TO LOSE HER POISE)

Fine tobacco!

HARLO!!

Fine tobacco...and it's toasted to....toasted to...

LOIS

(MAD)

To taste better... Toasted to taste better! When I pounded it into your head last night, I thought that fat would absorb something!

DOM

Darling --

LOIS

You keep quiet! Now look here, Harlow --

JACK

Mrs. Wilson --

LOIS

You shut up!...Now look here, Harlow. I'm going to give you one more chance! Now take it again and start right from the beginning!

HARLOW

Okay....Ladies and gentlemen...

LS, TFM.

LOIS, JACK, AND DON

TFM!!

HARLOW

I mean S M F...

LOIS

S M F! I spent three weeks with you, trying to teach you something. How can you embarrass me like this?....
Your mother....your own flesh and blood.

DURING ABOVE SPEECH, LOIS GRABS THE VIOLIN OUT OF JACK'S HAND AND HITS HARLOW OVER THE HEAD WITH IT.

JACK

Mrs. Wilson!

SHE HANDS JACK BACK THE VIOLIN STUB AND PUSHES HARLOW OFF THE STAGE.

LOIS

Got off the stage.....

(PUSHING DON)

And you, to...Off, off, off, off.

SHE PUSHES THEM BOTH OFF THE STAGE, LEAVING JACK STANDING THERE WITH THE STUB OF A VIOLIN IN HIS HAND.

JACK

After Oklahoma City, I'm going to visit all of the key cities that I can work into my schedule....
But right now I'm going to play a duet with Gisele MacKenzie.

If you remember, we played one together last year and we got so many requests to ---

GISELE ENTERS CARRYING TWO VIOLINS.

GISELE

Jack...Jack...I saw what happened so I got a violin for you, too.

JACK

Thank you, Gisele.

(CALLING O.S.)

Oh, stagehand!

STAGEHAND COMES ON. JACK GIVES HIM THE BROKEN VIOLIN

Save the strings.

STAGEHAND EXITS

Gisele, I hope the emotional scene you just saw with Mr. and Mrs. Don Wilson and their son Harlow dldn't disturb you.

GISELE

Oh, no - not at all...By the way, Jack, don't the Winstons....

You can't mention Winstons on this program.

GISELE

Haven't the <u>Wilsons</u> got a son bigger than Harlow?

JACK

Yeah, he's not in Hollywood any more. They had to move him to Glendale to make way for the freewayYou know, Gisele, a while back I was talking about playing the violin on a personal appearance... You know I've always felt that if I had studied the violin diligently -- and I mean this -- today I could have been what I've always wanted to be -- Treasurer of the Musicians Union...Now, Gisele, what do you suggest that we play this time?

Well...How about Mendelsohn's Concerto in E Minor?

GISELE

JACK

Oh, for heaven's sakes, you would pick the one number that always gives me trouble.

GISELE

All right then...How about Zigeunerweisen by Sarasate?

JACK

Well, I hate to play anything when I don't know the composer, personally. There must be something else.

GISELE

All right, how about "Raise The Awning, Mother, Daddy's Leading A Shady Life."

Hmmm...Gisele, did you make that up?

GISELE

When you hit me with that Freeway joke, I had to come back with something.

JAÇK

I don't blame you. I'll tell you what...why don't we play the number we played a year ago. Everybody seemed to like it.

GISELE

You mean "Getting To Know You"?

JACK

Yes, that's the one and do me a favor, will you? Don't show off.
Just play the harmony.

GISELE

Okay,

JACK

Wait till I rosin up a little

bit.

TAKES OUT ROSIN AND STARTS TO ROSIN BOW

GISELE

Jack, green rosin?

JACK

This has chlorophyll in it...

Dennis gave it to me on

St. Patrick's Day. All right let's do it..."Getting To

Know You"....

THEY PLAY DUET "GETTING TO KNOW YOU"

(APPLAUSE)

DON

Jack will be back in just a moment, but first a word to cigarette smokers.

CUT TO CLOSING COMMERCIAL.

THE AMERICAN TOBACCO COMPANY LUCKY STRIKE TV FILM COMMERCIAL #113

GISELE MACKENZIE AND HAPPY JOE LUCKY

OPEN ON TIGHT CLOSEUP OF BACK OF A CANVAS CHAIR, IT READS "GISELE MACKENZIÉ."

PULL BACK TO TWO-SHOT OF GISELE IN ATTRACTIVE COCKTAIL DRESS SEATED IN CANVAS CHAIR. HAPPY JOE LUCKY IS ALSO SEATED ACROSS ARMS OF A CANVAS CHAIR PLAYING ACCORDION. HIS CHAIR READS "HAPPY JOE LUCKY." (MUSIC OVER: ACCORDION PLAYING LAST "IT'S LIGHT UP TIME" PHRASE IN "LIGHT UP TIME" SONG.)

HAPPY JOE LUCKY (ON CAMERA)

How do you like your music, Gisele?

GISELE (ON CAMERA)

Depends. Right now I'm in a bouncy

mood.

CUT TO CU OF HAPPY JOE.

HAPPY JOE (V.O.)

Let's go!

CUT BACK TO WIDE SHOT: HAPPY JOE PLAYING ACCORDION IN LEFT FOREGROUND WHILE GISELE SINGS AND DANCES IN RIGHT MIDDLEGROUND.

(MUSIC: QUICK INTRO AND A SWINGING ACCORDION VERSION OF "LIGHT OF TIME.")

GISELE

Light up a Lucky
It's light-up time
Be Happy, Go Lucky
It's light-up time.

TV FILM COMMERCIAL #113 (CONTINUED)

CUT TO TWO-SHOT AS SONG ENDS. HAPPY JOE'S HAT FLIES IN THE AIR IN VAUDEVILLE FASHION AND HE REACHES UP AND RETRIVES IT. HAPPY JOE (ON CAMERA)

Wowee!

And the second

GISELE (SPEAKING ON CAMERA)

CUT TO MEDIUM SHOT OF GISELE.

CUT TO TWO-SHOT. HAPPY JOE SWAYS WITH EYES CLOSED, LOST IN RAPTURE AS HE PLAYS AND GISELE SINGS. But sometimes I like my music dreamy -- like this.

(MUSIC: DREAMY ACCORDION VERSION OF "LIGHT UP TIME" SONG)

GISELE (SINGING ON CAMERA)

For the taste that you like Light up a Lucky Strike Relax ...

It's light up time!

AS HAPPY JOE PLAYS GLISSANDO, GISELE RECLINES IN HER CHAIR.

(MUSIC: GLISS)

HAPPY JOE (SPEAKING ON CAMERA)

CUT TO CU OF HAPPY JOE AS HE PRODUCES A PACK OF LUCKIES AND SPEAKS. Yessir. Fine tobacco that's toasted to taste even better.
That's what makes a Lucky taste so good. You'll say it's the best-tasting cigarette you ever smoked.

TV FILM COMMERCIAL #113 (CONFINUED)

CUT BACK TO TWO-SHOT AS HAPPY JOE PLAYS AND SINGS AND GISELE TAKES A LUCKY FROM HIS PACK AND PUTS IT IN HIS MOUTH.

HAPPY JOE (SINGING ON CAMERA)

For the taste that you like

GISELE (SINGING ON CAMERA)

Light up a Lucky Strike.

HAPPY JOE (SINGING ON CAMERA)

HAPPY JOE PLACES ACCORDION ON FLOOR AND SITS ON IT. AS IT COMPRESSES BENEATH HIM IT PLAYS THE GLISS.

Right now ...

(MUSIC: ACCORDION GLISS)

GISELE LIGHT HIS LUCKY FOR HIM.

GISELE (SPEAKING ON CAMERA)

Light up a Lucky!

HAPPY JOE EXHALES HAPPILY AND THEY SING TOGETHER

HAPPY JOE & GISELE (SINGING ON CAMERA)

It's light up time!

(TAG)

JACK AND GISELE COME OUT TO "LOVE IN BLOOM" AND APPLAUSE.

JACK

Thank you very much, ladies and gentlemen...Gisele, again may I say how nice it was to have you on the program.....and I want to tell you how much I enjoy your show and Dorothy Collins and all of them.

GISELE

Well, thank you, and I must say that your support and your generous guidance and advice have been a great help to me.

JACK

Oh well....

GISELE

No, no I mean it. I don't know what I would have done without you. Why, you've been like...like a father to me.

JACK

Hammanm....Go be nice to people. I'll see you afterwards.

GISELE

Thank you, Jack.

GISELE EXITS

Ladies and gentlemen, be sure to watch Ann Sothern next Sunday and I'll be back in two weeks... when my guest star will be Chief Thunder Cloud. He's not much of an actor, but it's all in the family....Goodnight, folks.
