OPEN ON ANIMATED MUSICAL STAFF WITH TREBLE CLFF LOCATED CAMERA LEFT. IN SYNC WITH THE MUSIC NOTES OF THE KRUETZER ETUDE POP ON LETTERS SPELLING OUT "THE" AND "JACK".

(MUSIC: KRUETZER ETUDE PLAYED ON SOLO VIOLIN)

The second secon

LOSING TREBLE CLEF CAMERA NOW BEGINS TO PAN ALONG STAFF PICKING UP LETTERS THAT POP ON IN SYNC TO NOTES OF ETUDE. WORD "BINNY" IS NOW VISIBLE.

(MUSIC: ETUDE CONTINUES)

AS PAN CONTINUES LETTERS OF WORD "PROGRAM" POP ON IN SYNC AS THE MUSIC BUILDS AND HOLDS.

(MUSIC: ETUDE CONTINUES)

ONCE THE "PROGRAM" IS
COMPLETE ON THE SCREIN, ET
ANIMATES DOWN TO FIRST SPACE
IN THE STAFF AND THE WORD "THE
TAKES A BALANCED POSITION ON
THE TOP SPACE. SIMULTANEOUSLY
SLIDING IN FROM EITHER SIDE
AND HEAVILY SHADED WORDS:
"JACK" AND "BENNY."

(MUSIC: STING AND HOLD UNDER:)

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)

ON From Television City in Hollywood, the USLY
E Jack Benny Program...

AS GUEST ARE ANNOUNCED THE WORKS "JACK" AND "BINNY"
ANIMATE INTO TWO BLACK LINES AND THE STAFF BEGINS TO TURN FROM A HORIZONTAL TO A VIRTICAL FOSITION.

....with Jack's guest, Gary Cooper...

IN SYMC WITH THE WORDS "MUCKE" CTRING" BLACK LIMES ANDMATE INTO LETTERS; THE STAFF LIMES FORM MUCKY STRIKE CIGARETTES IN PARK POSITION.

(MUSIC: SEGUE TO LAST SIX BARS OF HONEST TASTE" SONG UNDER:)

ANMOUNCER (V.O.)

PULLAEVE LOGO NOW ANIMATIS ARO FID WORDS "LUCKY STRIKE" AS PACK BEGINS TO TAKE SHAPE. Brought to you by Lucky Strike! Get the genuine article.

PAIN NOW COMPLETELY FORMED TAKED PIRSPECTIVE SETTING AT CENTER SCREEN. A FEW CIGARETTES POP INTO VIEW. Get the honest taste of a Lucky

Strike.

(MUSIC: UP TO END)

THE AMERICAN TOBACCO COMPANY LUCKY STRIKE ONE MINUTE TV FILM COMMERCIAL

#179 WOOD LATHE OPERATOR -- FROGMAN (CARTON ENDING)

OPEN ON LOW ANGLE SHOT CLOSEUP OF PIECE OF WOOD SPINNING ON A LATHE. MAN IN SMART FLANNEL SPORT SHIRT STANDS BEHIND IT. HE BRINGS CUTTING TOOL TO BEAR ON THE PIECE AND SHAVINGS FLY.

WHIRR OF MACHINE...LOW BLUNT (SOUND: RAT-TAT-TAT OF FIRST TURNING SEQUES TO HIGHER AND HIGHER WHINE AS PIECE IS SMOOTHED

-- NOT TOO LOUD)

COMMENTATOR (O.S.)

PULL SWIFTLY BACK TO MEDIUM SHOT, TAKING IN MAN, A HANDSONE, INTELLIGENT, RUGGED GUY.

A smoke goes good when you're working.

HE STOPS WORKING, PICKS UP A LIGHTED LUCKY, TAKES A PUFF AND TURNS BACK TOWARD HIS WORK. (SOUND: CUTTING OUT IN SYNC. WHIRR OF MACHINE CONTINUES)

Or is it that work goes better when you're smoking?

Take a Lucky Strike.

(SOUND: WHINE OF TURNING IN AGAIN SOFTIN UNDER:)

CUT TO LOW ANGLE SHOT FRAMING MAN'S HEAD AT BOTTOM CAMERA LEFT. THE LUCKY DANGLES COMPORTABLY FROM HIS LIPS AS HE RESUMES HIS WORK. ACROSS TOP OF SOREEN TITLE "LUCKY STRIKE" SPINS ON LENGTH-WISE.

HOLD TITLE

Yeah, take a Lucky Strike next time you smoke on the job. You'll find ...

CUT BACK TO MEDIUM SHOT.

TITLE OUT. GUY TURNS OFF LATHE AND PUFFS THOUGHTFULLY

LOCKING AT HIS WORK.

...it's mild, but not too mild.

(SOUND: SPEEDING GASOLINE ENGINE AND THUD OF HULL ON WAVES--

(SOUND: WHIRRING OF MACHINE

FADES OUT)

NOT TOO LOUD) (MORE)

ABRUPT CUT TO LOW ANGLE SHOT OF SPEEDING FROG MAN. PICK UP CRAFT DOING ABOUT TWENTY KNOTS TOWARD CAMERA.

#179 WCOD LATHE OPERATOR (CONT'D)

CUT TO THREE QUARTER REVERSE ANGLE SHOT OF BOAT SPEEDING TO PICK UP LINE OF WAITING FROG MEN, BRAWNY ANCHOR MAN IN RUBBER RAFT AMIDSHIP ENGAGES FIRST MAN WITH ROPE LOOP AND WHIPS HIM INTO RAFT WITH ONE SWIFT MOTION. BY THE TIME FIRST MAN HAS SCRAMBLED UP OUT OF RAFT AND INTO BOAT, SECOND MAN IS ENGAGED.

CUT TO AMIDSHIP CLOSEUP OF SPEEDING BOAT AS SECOND FROG MAN CLAMBERS ABOARD.

CUT TO MEDIUM CLOSEUP OF WET FROG MAN FRESH FROM WATER HUDDLING AGAINST BULKHEAD. ANOTHER MAN HANDS FROG MAN LIGHTHD LUCKY. HE THEN ENJOYS THAT FIRST DELICIOUS DRAG AFTER HOURS IN THE WATER. MAN NEVER ONCE LOOKS AT CANERA. TITLE LUCKY STRIKE ZOOMS UP BESIDE FROG MAN IN 3-D LETTERS.

CUT ON DOWN BEAT TO CLOSEUP OF DRIPPING WET FROG MAN AND HIS LUCKY.

POP ON PACK RIGHT MIDDLE GROUND ON BEAT AFTER "FORGET." 133M UP ON "TASTE."

CUT ON BEAT TO CLOSEUP OF LAPHE MAN AT RIGHT.

POP ON PACK AT LEFT ON PEAT AFTER "LIKE." ZOOM UP ON "TASTE."

OUT ON BEAT TO TIGHT CLOSEUP, LOSING PACK. (SOUND: ROAR OF BOAT CONTINUES)

COMMENTATOR (CONT'D)

CIRCLE WITH TITLE SLIDES OVER AND BECOMES BULLSEYE AS CARTON FORMS AROUND IT. IN SYNC. HOLD WORDS OF THEMELLINE. COMMENTATOR (OVER)

Get the genuine article.

AFTER OPENING COMMERCIAL, JACK COMES OUT TO MUSIC & APPLAUSE

JACK

Gee, that was a wonderful reception. I think I'll come out again. Good evening, ladies and gentlemen, and welcome to the warmup to the Ed Sullivan Show. Well, here I am back for my ninth year for Lucky Strike. Gosh, how time flies...Just imagine since I started in television, all the rest of you are nine years older ... Anyway, this is the start of a new season and I must say it's difficult to be funny with all the things that have been happening in the world: the crisis in the Middle East; the trouble in Algeria; the unsettled disuation in Formosa; postage going up to four cents.... It's murder! Yesterday alone it cost me twelve cents to answer my fan mail...So if you like me, please just watch, don't write....But anyway, I must say it's wonderful to be back here again.

(MORE)

JACK (CONT'D)

And right now, it gives me great pleasure to bring to you my special guest, a man who for many years has been one of Hollywood's top personalities...and here he is....Gary Cooper.

GARY COOPER COMES OUT TO APPLAUSE.

You already get more applause than I had. Gary, I want to tell you that it's really a great thrill having you on my first program of the season.

GARY

Thank you very much Jack.

JACK

Now I know you've had a lot of offers from many other television programs and you've always refused. You when I asked you to come on my show, you immediately accepted.

GARY

Well, Jack, to tell you the uputh,

I was going to turn you down, too,
but when you teld me that your
guests on your show today were
going to be John Foster Dulles,
Bernard Baruch and President
Elsenhower, I just couldn't refuse.

JACK LOOKS AT AUDIENCE, THEN LOOKS BACK AT GARY.

GARY

(LCOKING AROUND)

Where are they?

JACK

(TO AUDIENCE)

Hmmm...a big star and I trick
him with a gag that wouldn't work on
Dennis Day.

GARY

What did you say.

JACK

Nothing, nothing... Anyway, Gary, I appreciate your donating your time to the --

GARY

Wait a minute...what do you mean "donating"? I expect to get paid for this appearance.

JACK

Paid:

GARY

Gertainly. I may walk slowly to the bank, but when I get there, I want them to have a reason for saying, "Howdy."

JACK

Then you want money?

GARY

Ten thousand dollars.

JACK

Ten thousand. But, Gary, I really thought you came on because of our great friendship...I mean, we have been friends for years...how many times I've been over at your house for dinner...three or four nights a week...I don't know how many times for lunch.

GARY

I'm up, Jack.

JACK

You're suppose to say ten thousand, but don't you worry about it. He hurt his back anyway. Gary hurt his back and if you miss a line, it's okay.

Well, all right... Now, Gary, in your career in show business you've won many awards, bonors, and citations. Tell me, of all the things that you've won, what has given you your greatest thrill?

GARY

Well, that happened just two weeks ago.

JACK

What was that?

GARY

I came in second in a Hula Hoop contest.

JACK

Well, second ain't bad for someone who hasn't any hips.

(LAUGHU)

That was an ad lib. You know what an ad lib is, don't you Gary?

GARY

Yes...An ad lib is when you step away from the script and louse up the whole show.

JACK

Hmm...for ten thousand dollars he's fussy, yet... Now, Gary, I understand you just made a picture called "Man Of The West." They say it's not only exciting, but the suspense is terrific and the photography is out of this world.

GARY

Well, Jack, we think we've got a good one.

JACK

I can hardly wait to see it.

Tell me, Gary, when is the studie going to have the previow — the one where they invite all of us celebrities?

GARY

Well they had that last night.

JACK

I must have gone to bed early.

How come I didn't get an

invitation.

GARY

Well, Jack, when it comes to a free preview, you're one man who doesn't need an invitation. The minute you see a searchlight in the sky, you put on your tuxedo and head right for it.

JACK

What?

GARY

In our business you're known as Benny the Moth.

JACK

For a fellow who spent all his life saying, "They went that-a-way," you're pretty funny...Well, dary, I want to thank you again for soming on my show --

GARY

Well, I'm not going just yet. JACK

Moutre not?

GARY

No...since this is my first appearance as a guest star on television. I'd like to sing a seng.

(APPLAUSE)

JACK

Gee, I didn't know that you sing, Gary.

GARY

Oh sure. I've been singing for years. I'm a regular Jeff Chandler.

JACK

Oh...oh...Well, have you got a number prepared?

GARY

Sure...and the Sportsmen are going to back me up.

JACK

The Sportsmen? You mean, my quartet?

GARY

(CAILS)

Come on out, fellows.

SPORTSMEH QUARTET COME OUT WITH GUITARS TO APPLAUSE.

JACK

You really have a singing voice and you're prepared. Well, go ahead.

(INTRO)

SPORTSMEN

Johnny is a joker.

GARY

He's a bird.

SPORTSMEN

A very funny joker.

GARY

He's a bird.

SPORTSMEN

But when he jokes my honey.

GARY

He's a dog.

SPORTSMEN

His joking ain't so funny.

GARY

What a dog.

SPORTSMEN

Johrny is a joker. That would

like to steal my baby.

GARY

He's a bird dog.

SPORTSMEN

Johnny sings a love song.

GARY

Like a bird.

SPORTSMEN

Sings the sweetest love song.

GARY

You ever heard.

SPORTSMEN

But when he sings to my gal.

GARY

What a hound.

SPORTSMEN

To me he's just a wolf dog.

GARY

On the prowl.

SPORTSMEN

Johnny wants to fly away and

puppy love my baby.

GARY

He's a bird dog.

SPORTSMEN

Hey, bird dog, get away from my chick

Hey, bird dog, you better get away quick

Bird dog, you better find a chicken

little love of your own.

Johnny kissed the teacher.

GARY

He's a bird.

SPORTSMEN

He tip toed up to reach her.

CARY

He's a bird.

SPORTSMEN

He's a teacher's pet now.

GARY

He's a dog.

SPORTSMEN

What he wants he can get now.

GARY

What a dog.

SPORTSMEN

He even made the teacher let him sit next to my baby.

GARY

He's a bird dog.

SPORTSMEN

He even made the teacher let him sit next to my baby.

GARY

He's a bird dog...yup.

(APPLAUSE)

AFTER SONG, SPORTSMEN EXIT.

JACK

Gary, you amaze me. For a shy naive guy, you've got more guts than anyone I know.

GARY

I thought you'd like it...Well,

I've got to be running along.

I have to get back to the studio
to continue our pasting.

JACK

Casting?

GARY

Yes. You see, we think so much of Man of the West that we've already started making a sequel.

JACK

Oh...Say, Gary, in this sequel that you're making to Man of the West, how about giving me a part in the picture.

GARY

Well, Jack, the only one that's not cast yet is the part of my brother.

JACK

Good, I'll take it.

GARY

No no...It's my twin brother.

JACK

Oh...oh. (AD LIB) Smog doesn't bother you, does it?

(TRIES TO GET AS TALL AS GARY BY STANDING ON HIS TOES.)

Couldn't you play your part sitting down?

GARY

I'm afraid not.

JACK

Well, then I guess my height sorta lets me out.

GARY

Well, don't let that worry you,

Jack. If it weren't that, it

would be something else.

JACK

Well, thank you

GARY

I enjoyed it very much.

THEY SHAKE HANDS AND GARY COOPER EXITS TO APPLAUSE.

JACK

(AD LIB)

Gary really hurt his back doing the Hoola Hoop. I didn't think he'd be on, that's always been my luck in pictures. I'm too short to be Gary's brother, and I was too tall for Toulouse-Leatrec... You know, ladies and gentlemen, Don Wilson hasn't ceen on this first show because he's appearing in a play which opens in Atlantic City temorrow night. A show called "Make A Million"...love that title. However, he will be with us this season on most of our future programs.

(MORE)

JACK (CONT'D)

Anyway, I know Don is watching and the Sportsmen are very anxious to dedicate a number to Don Wilson.

SPORTSMEN SING MIDDLE COMMERCIAL

APPLAUSE

SPORTSMEN

Never was a man who could forget

The taste of a genuine cigarette

Get the honest taste a man can like

The honest taste of a Lucky Strike.

How do you like our new commercial, Don.

Too bad you couldn't be here to bring it on

But don't you worry...Don...don't you fret!

Your substitute can really sell a cigarette.

(SPOKEN)

Don meet Donna.

DONNA

Everybody loves a lover

I'm a lover

Ev'rybody loves me

You have all heard Doris Day sing that way

Now we have another version

SPORTSMEN

Ev'rybody loves a Lucky

Loves the honest taste, oh, yes they do.

DONNA

And I love ev'rybody

Since I fell in love with you

SPORTSMEN

Hey there, Don, how do you like your substitute She's not fat, not a bit, but she's kind a cute! You can see she is not very tall

And a bit small

Nothing at all like our own Don Wilson

DONNA

(IN UNISON WITH FOLLOWING CHORUS BY BOYS)

L, S, M

L, S, M, F, T Lucky Strike

L, S, M,

L, S, M, F, T You will like Lucky Strike

Light up a Lucky now

What da ya say

Really okay

SPORTSMEN

Ev'rybody loves a Lucky

Can't forget that honest taste in Luckies

Fine tobacco

Smooths each puff

(LIGHT MATCHES)

Sure enough

Really okay.

DONNA

Ev'rybody loves a Lucky

I sell honest Luckies, yes, I do

And I love ev'rybody

Since they fell in love with

Fell in love with

Fell in love with you.

I'll be a Lucky smoker, too.

GO TO BLACK

OPEN ON:

WESTERN SALOON SET ON A SOUND STAGE

THERE IS A BAR, A ROUND CARD TABLE, AND WINDOW IN THE BACK WITH "SALOON" PRINTED ON IT. THREE MEN ARE SITTING AT THE TABLE RELAXING. ON A BENCH, HALF IN AND HALF OUT OF THE WESTERN SALOON SET, SIT FOUR MEN IN WESTERN COSTUMES. THE DIRECTOR IS LOOKING AT A SCRIPT. HE PUTS THE BOOK DOWN AND GOES OVER TO THE FOUR MEN ON A BENCH. THEY STAND UP. ONE IS TALLER THAN THE OTHER THREE.

DIRECTOR

I appreciate you gentlemen coming down for the audition, but the part we're trying to cast in this sequel to Man of the West is that of Gary Cooper's twin brother...

Therefore, I'm afraid we wen't be able to use you three, I'm sorry.

(POINTING TO THREE SHORTER ONES)

However, (POINTING TO TALL MAN) would you mind waiting?

TALL MAN

Thank you.

THE OTHER THREE MEN LEAVE

DIRECTOR

Mr. Cooper should be here to run through the scene with you any moment. In the meantime, may I have your name, please?

TALL MAN

Huston...Bob Huston.

DIRECTOR

(WRITING DOWN NAME)

Address?

TALL MAN

4946 Whitsett.

DIRECTOR

Thank you.

GARY COOPER ENTERS DRESSED IN WESTERN COSTUME

GARY

Sorry I'm late, but I had to make an appearance on the Jack Benny Show.

DIRECTOR

I thought you were only going to do a few minutes.

GARY

Well, that was all I was supposed to do, but I thought I'd stay

longer. The president was watching.

DIRECTOR

I was busy here and I missed it.
How did the show go?

GARY

Pretty good. Of course, I threw in quite a few ad libs. You know what an ad lib is, don't you? That's when someone steps out of the script and saves the whole show.

DIRECTOR

, which is the superscript to α

(LAUGHS)

By the way, Gary, this is Bob Huston. We're going to audition him to play the part of your twin brother.

GARY

Fine.

(LOOKING AT TALL MAN)

Well, you're certainly the right height. Shall we get started?

DIRECTOR

Certainly.

(TO MEN SITTING AT CARD TABLE)

Okay, men, get ready for the scene.

THE MEN PUT ON THEIR HATS, FIX THE CARDS AND PREPARE FOR THE CARD GAME IN THE SCENE. A GIRL COMES INTO THE SCENE AND GOES OVER TO DIRECTOR

GIRL

I beg your pardon, Mr. Bentley.

DIRECTOR

Yest

GIRL

Another actor just came in who would like to try out for the part.

DIRECTOR

Well, if he's the right type, he can have the next audition. Send him in.

GIRL GOES OVER TO DOOR.

GIRL

You may come in, now.

JACK ENTERS DRESSED IN WESTERN COSTUME IDENTICAL TO GARY'S. HE IS WEARING BOOTS THAT MAKE HIM SIX INCHES TALLER THAN NORMAL. HE STANDS IN THE DOORWAY FOR THE LAUGH.

DIRECTOR

Would you mind stepping over here

for a minute?

JACK WALKS OVER TO THE DIRECTOR.

DIRECTOR

How do you do.

JACK

Howdy.

DIRECTOR

Do you mind telling me your name?

JACK

Morgan...Tex Morgan.

DIRECTOR

Tex Morgan, eh?

JACK

Yup!

(KICKS IMAGINARY DIRT)

I guess there's no use waiting

because I certainly fit the part

of Gary Cooper --

DIRECTOR

Where do you live?

JACK

What did you say?

DIRECTOR

Where do you live?

JACK

10 North Frederick.

(GIVES GARY A BRAZEN LOOK)

Now if you don't mind, I'd like

to get this here audition over

with because I've got myself a

very important appointment.

DIRECTOR

We'll try to rush it. What time is your appointment?

GARY

If he says "High Noon," I'll ad lib a bullet right between his eyes...

JACK

What did you say, Shorty?

GARY

If it's all right with you can we get on with it?

JACK

Certainly. What do I do?

DIRECTOR

Nothing. There's a gentleman ahead of you.

JACK

But it's silly to audition anybody else. I'm perfect for the part.

DIRECTOR

Will you please sit down?

JACK

Okay, but remember...I'm next.

JACK SITS DOWN ON THE BENCH.

DIRECTOR

Come on, let's get started. Now we begin where these three fellows are playing cards with Gary's twin brother. Get closer to the table, men.

JACK

(SINGS)

Do not forsake me, oh my darling...
On this our wedding day.

Do not forsake me...

DIRECTOR

Quiet!

JACK

I was just trying to get in the mood.

DIRECTOR

If you want to get in the mood, keep your eye on Mr. Huston...

(INDICATING TALL MAN)

bocause that's the part you'll be auditioning for.

JACK

Ah'm a-watchin'. And you better be good, Mr. Huston, because I'm next.

DIRECTOR

Okay, start the scene. Okay,

boys, action.

THE MEN PICK UP THEIR CARDS. GARY'S TWIN IS DEALING.

1ST MAN

Give me two cards.

HUSTON GIVES HIM TWO CARDS.

2ND MAN

One.

HUSTON GIVES HIM ONE CARD.

3RD MAN

Two.

HUSTON GIVES HIM TWO CARDS.

TALL MAN

I'll take three for myself.

HE STARTS TO DEAL HIMSELF THREE CARDS AND ON THE SECOND ONE, THE 1ST MAN SLAPS HIS HAND OVER HUSTON'S HAND.

LST MAN

Wait a minute, I saw you.

THE THREE MEN JUMP UP AND PULL THEIR GUNS.

1ST MAN

You were dealing off the bottom

of the deck.

COOPER GOES OVER TO THE TABLE WITH HIS HANDS ON HIS GUNS.

GARY

Drop those guns.

THEY DROP THEIR GUNS.

GARY

There'll be no shooting. This is my twin brother and I'm here to see that this is a fair fight.

1ST MAN

Okay.

THE THREE MEN START BEATING UP THE TALL MAN. THEY HIT HIM WITH CHAIRS, THROW HIM AROUND THE ROOM, ONE HOLDS HIM WHILE OTHER TWO HIT HIM, THEY GENERALLY GIVE HIM THE BEATING OF HIS LIFE, AND AT THE FINISH THROW HIM THROUGH THE PLATE GLASS WINDOW. DURING THE FIGHT, JACK REACTS IN HORROR AT THE PART HE HAS ASKED TO AUDITION FOR.

DIRECTOR

Good, good.

(TO JACK)

Okay, Morgan, you're next.

JACK LOOKS AT AUDIENCE. JACK GETS DOWN ON HIS KNEES AND STARTS TO WALK OFF ON HIS KNEES.

GARY
